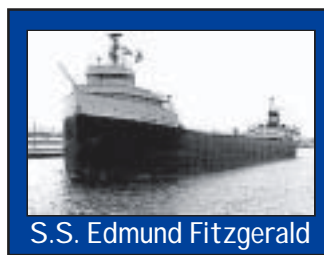

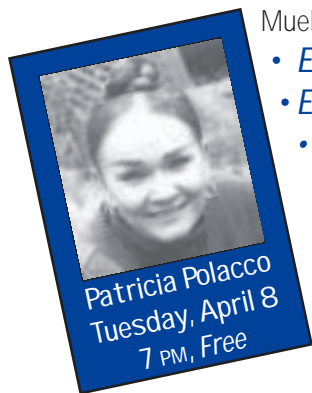

From the publishers of MasterPlots, **Magill OnAuthors** covers famous and not-so-famous authors from all over the world. This database provides information on authors who have made important contributions to all areas of literature.



Each entry gives an overview of the author's life and achievements. The database includes: Critical Surveys, Notable Poets, Shakespeare, Mystery and Detective Fiction, and World Philosophers and Their Works. **Magill OnLiterature** includes plot summaries, literary criticism and reviews of commonly assigned literary works.
