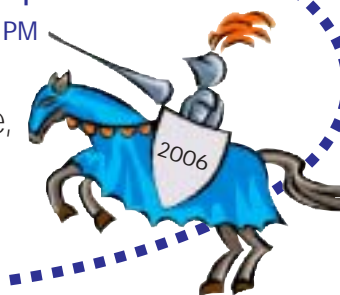

Library Board Frequently Asked Question

Question: Why does the Library charge to borrow videos and DVDs?

Answer: When the Library began offering videos many years ago, videos were expensive to purchase. In order to provide a collection without impacting the book budget, a charge was instituted that funded the purchase of videos. The money collected from video/DVD rentals continues to provide a revenue source for the Library that contributes to financing Library services. The funds are still used to purchase videos and DVDs rather than reducing the book and materials budget to offer this service. The rental charge has not been increased over the years but the length of time that a video/DVD can be borrowed has gone from 3 days to 7 days.
