America has split into two warring nations and Day, a famous criminal, and June, a prodigy soldier hired to capture him, discover they have a common enemy.

MacHale, D.J. **Sylo** (2013)

Pemberwick is cut off from the outside world, after a secret branch of the U.S. Navy, informs residents that the island has been hit by a lethal virus and must be

quarantined.

Marrs, John The One (2018)

10 years ago, the company found the gene that pairs you with your soul mate. 5 very different people have received the notification that they've been matched.

Ness, Patrick The Knife of Never Letting Go (2008)

Shusterman, Neal **Unwind** (2007)

Three teens go to extreme lengths to keep themselves from being "unwound" and

having their body parts harvested for others to use.

Simmons, Kristen Article 5 (2012)

Ember keeps a low profile in a society in which Moral Statutes have replaced the

Bill of Rights, until her boyfriend arrests her rebellious mother.

Wells, Dan **Partials** (2012)

Ravaged by disease and war with a manmade race of people called Partials, the

future rests in the hands of Kira Walker, a 16-year-old medic in training.

Westerfeld, Scott **The Uglies** (2005)

Just before they turn 16, Tally must find and turn in her best friend who has run

away or lose her chance to be transformed into a Pretty with a carefree lifestyle.

Weyn, Suzanne The Bar Code Tattoo (2004)

In 2025, everyone must get a bar code tattoo on their 17th birthday, but Kayla

decides not to get hers and joins a resistance movement.

Seemingly the only person left alive after a nuclear war, a 16 year old girl is relieved to see a man until she realizes that he is a tyrant and she must escape.

Orwell, George **1984** (1949)

Winston Smith is monitored constantly and surrounded by the propaganda of Big

Brother, but he is finding ways to escape and have his own feelings and thoughts.

Goodman, Allegra **The Other Side of the Island** (2008)

When her parents are taken away, it is up to Honor and her friend Helix to

uncover a terrible secret about their Island and the Corporation that runs it.

Lloyd, Saci The Carbon Diaries 2015 (2009)

In 2015, when England becomes the first to introduce carbon dioxide rationing to

combat climate change, 16-year-old Laura documents the first year of rationing.

Sleator, William House of Stairs (1974)

Five orphans are involuntarily placed in a house of endless stairs as subjects for

a psychological experiment on conditioned human response.

Snyder, Maria Inside Out (2010)

Trella is a scrub, working the lower levels to keep the inside clean for the Uppers

and trying to avoid trouble until she accidentally starts a rebellion.
